RES. #1-20: To Adopt the Rules of Order of the Town Board of the Town of CHATHAM, NEW YORK. Offered by _____.

Whereas, Town Law, §63 provides that the Town Board may determine the rules of its procedure; Now, Therefore Be It Resolved that the following Rules of Order be and the same are hereby adopted pursuant to Town Law, §63: Rules of Order of the Town Board of the Town of CHATHAM, NEW YORK.

1. The Supervisor shall preside at all meetings of the Board and shall preserve order and decorum in debate.
2. The Supervisor, immediately following the opening of every regular meeting of the Board, shall proceed to the regular order of Town business as follows: reception of petitions and other communications addressed to the Town Board, reports of committees, reports of officers and departments and introduction of resolutions and motions.
3. Public Hearings: It shall be the duty of the Supervisor to preside at all general or special business hearings to instruct all persons addressing the Board to state their names and addresses. At such hearings, the Board may by special rules prescribe the time to be allotted to each speaker and the number of times each speaker may speak.
4. At the close of the public hearing as provided for in paragraph “3” above, the Supervisor may grant any member of the public in attendance at such meeting a reasonable opportunity to be heard on any question or subject in which the Town or its government is concerned.
5. Every resolution or motion must be seconded before being put to a vote by the Supervisor and all resolutions or motions shall be recorded in their entirety in the official minutes of the Town Board.
6. The Supervisor may offer or second a resolution or a motion and need not relinquish the chair for such purpose.
7. No motion or resolution may be brought to a vote except by the majority consent of those present, unless printed or typewritten copies thereof are presented to each member of the Board prior to the opening of the meeting at which such motion or resolution is offered.
8. When a question is under debate, no motion shall be entertained unless (a) for an adjournment or recess, (b) for the previous question to lay on the table, (c) to postpone to refer to a committee, or (d) to amend. These latter motions are neither amendable nor debatable.

9. No motion shall be made to offer any amendment to an amendment already before the Board on any proposition.

10. A majority vote of all the members of the Board shall be required to suspend these rules of order. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

11. If the above stated rules are, or become at any time, in conflict with the statutory law, the statutory law shall take precedence.

12. No member of the public shall disrupt the formality of a town board meeting.

13. Any persons speaking to the Board with the consent of the Supervisor shall address their remarks to the Board, unless permitted by the Supervisor or whoever is presiding over the Meeting. _____ seconded motion.

WHEREAS, a Project for the Albany Turnpike Road Traffic Signal in the Town of Chatham, Columbia County, PIN 8761.98 ("the Project") is eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S. Code, as amended, that calls for the apportionment of the costs such program to be borne at the ratio of 80% Federal Funds and 20% non-federal funds; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Chatham desires to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% of the non-federal share of the costs of construction and construction work.

RESOLVED, that the Chatham Town Board hereby authorizes the Town of Chatham to pay in the first instance 100% of the federal and non-federal share of the cost of construction and construction inspection work for the Project or portions thereof; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the sum of **\$250,000** is hereby appropriated from **DB9950** (or, appropriated pursuant to **Capital Projects Fund**) and made available to cover the cost of participation in the above phase of the Project; and it is further

RESOLVED, that in the event the full federal and non-federal share costs of the project exceeds the amount appropriated above, the Chatham Town Board shall convene as soon as possible to appropriate said excess amount immediately upon the notification by the Town Supervisor thereof, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Chatham Town Supervisor be and is hereby authorized to execute all necessary Agreements, certification or reimbursement requests for Federal Aid and/or applicable Marchiselli Aid on behalf of the Town of Chatham with the New York State Department of Transportation in connection with the advancement or approval of the Project and providing for the administration of the Project and the municipality's first instance funding of project costs and permanent funding of the local share of federal-aid and state-aid eligible Project costs and all Project costs within appropriations therefore that are not so eligible, and it is further

RESOLVED, that in addition to the Supervisor, the following municipal titles: **Superintendent of Highways** and **Budget Officer** are also hereby authorized to execute any necessary Agreements or certifications on behalf of the Municipality/Sponsor, with NYSDOT in connection with the advancement or approval of the project identified in the State/Local Agreement;
